Peter "Pete" Hoaglund began loving golf when his family moved from Minnesota to Wisconsin as a teenager, and he began working at Richland Center Golf Course and playing golf in all of his spare time. That was the beginning of a lifetime of golf.

Pete became a very good golfer. His high school didn't have a team, nor did he have the opportunities that are available today to receive a college scholarship. But he was good to the level that he was able to play some of the top courses in the world - including St. Andrews in Scotland, the birthplace of modern golf.

His love of golf was passed along to his family - Sue (his wife of 48 golfing years), daughter Kristi, sons Matt and Todd, and he was their teacher. He was so happy to see his granddaughters Hailey and Kailyn begin golf under John Keegan's teaching. "We planned our vacations

and even our Edward Jones company trips around golf. If there were great courses nearby, or one he hadn't played, those were the trips we went on," explained Sue.

When Pete passed away in April 2015, his family chose to honor his favorite sport by creating the "Pete Hoaglund Memorial Golf Fund" at the Community Foundation of Grundy County. This endowed fund will live forever and the annual income will be distributed to the golf team at Morris Community High School to support their needs, whether it be shirts, green fees, equipment, or travel.

"I would love to see more support for the golf team at MCHS," explained daughter Kristi Bennington. "And it goes beyond financial support. My niece and one other girl play on the boys' team because there aren't enough girls at



the high school to support a full girls team. Coach Matt Lafond then enters them with other girls to play conference, regional, and state separate from the boys. We'd love to see more kids play golf so that the high school team can have a full roster every year."

"Our goal of the Pete Hoaglund Memorial Golf Fund is to show the community that golf is a great sport, now and forever. My dad is proof that you can play golf your entire life, share it with your family, and travel the world playing it. It's a sport that teaches goals, values, respect, discipline, and it's one you can truly play your whole life."

The Hoaglund Fund was begun by the family, but anyone can contribute to it.
